It is only relatively recently that I learnt the actual differences between the misused terms "simple", "complicated", and "complex". Simple tasks are those that can be performed with minimal effort or skill, and the outcome is predictable. Complicated tasks are more intricate and may require specialized knowledge or skills to complete, but their outcome can still be determined if all the right steps are followed. A good example would be to think about constructing an IKEA bit of furniture.


Complex tasks, on the other hand, involve multiple variables, and the outcome is not readily predictable. Humans make things complicated!

In complex situations, a deeper understanding of the system and its components is necessary to achieve a desired outcome.

If you have spent deliberate practice to develop a skill, complicated and even complex it is important to recognize that what may seem simple to them, may have taken considerable time and effort to master. They have likely reached a level of unconscious competence, where the skill has become second nature and is performed effortlessly. However, this level of proficiency is often the result of years of dedicated practice and repetition.

It is crucial to remember that what appears effortless to an outsider is the result of hard work and a deep understanding of the underlying principles and processes involved. What skills are you aiming to develop?


